In recent years, St. Teresa's gradually developed and expanded. It now has eleven classrooms, a pastoral care room and an office. There are two sections to the school. The Nursery caters for 4-6 year olds and Primary 1-6 for 7-12 year olds. It is a single stream school with a double stream in Primary 5. The pupil population is 340, with equal numbers of boys and girls. The staff consists of six women teachers and four men teachers as well as a secretary, cook, caretaker and security men. The school has a cook because the children get a nutritious porridge breakfast daily made from rice, groundnuts, sugar and tamarind. This is possible thanks to St. Fanchea's College, Enniskillen, Co. Fermanagh, Holy Cross Primary School, Killarney, Co. Kerry and Mercy Solidarity Fund.

On completing Secondary School, most of the graduates get on well having had a good foundation in the basics of reading, writing and arithmetic in St. Theresa's. Christian formation is an intrinsic part of school life. This is cultivated through a climate of service, prayer and handing on of values in the school community.
