

## **Letter From Catherine McAuley**

Sister M. Catherine Meagher Naas Convent, Baggot St. [c. November 18, 1840]<sup>1</sup>

My Dear Sister M. Catherine

I am very happy to receive a note from you and regret exceedingly that it is impossible to admit the young person. We are always crowded to excess at this season – so many leaving Dublin, dismissing servants and few engaging any, we have every day most sorrowful applications from interesting young creatures, confectioners & dress makers, who at this season cannot get employment and are quite unprotected. I am sure I spoke with two yesterday who were hungry, tho' of nice appearance.

Their dejected faces have been before me ever since. I was afraid of hurting their feelings by offering them food & had no money. The poor law Tax has deprived us of much help. We find it very difficult to keep up the poor Institution.
