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❖ Scripture Reading

Lk 1: 31-35 & 38.

The angel Gabriel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end.” And Mary said to the angel, “How shall this be, since I have no husband?” And the angel said to her, “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. Mary said, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word.”



❖ Meditation

On our special day of thanksgiving and celebration this reading fills me with a variety of intense emotions, Lord:

Tranquility with Mary in prayer,
Excitement at Gabriel's appearance,
Confusion at your request to a young, innocent virgin,
Empathy with her question,
Utter astonishment at Gabriel's explanation,
Anger at the ridicule to which Mary was to be exposed, and
Shock at her brave and faith-filled response.

How could you make such a request, Lord?

How could she accept with such calm and trust?

On reflection, Lord, maybe she was supported and comforted by knowledge of the challenges which you presented to her predecessors, and which they accepted and transcended in your name:

Sarah, the aged and fragile wife of Abraham, who at your request welcomed motherhood, and became her foremother in faith through Jacob (Gen 21:1-8);

Rebecca, the young girl, who agreed to leave her own people and marry a man she had never met in order to ensure the continuity of your Promise to Abraham and Sarah (Gen 24);

Miriam, whose birth seemed inconsequential, but whose faith and persuasive powers with her brothers Moses and Aaron, secured the freedom of your people from spiritual and temporal slavery (Ex 15:20-21, Num 12:1-16 & 20:1).

Judith, the young widow, whose prayer and leadership saved Israel from the Assyrians and protected the faith and property of her people (Judith 14-15:12).

In hindsight Lord, I ask you to forgive me for allowing my emotions to run wild. I see now that Mary, like her predecessors in faith, has been given to us and to all succeeding generations as an inspiration. We too, must be open to doing your will and serving your people. You've continued to call women to ministry down through the ages and to be victorious through their efforts.

Long after Mary's extraordinary response, your people became victims of poverty and religious discrimination once more. You responded by calling our Foundress, Catherine McAuley, to rescue them. You entrusted her with the privilege of ensuring the continuity of the **Promise** which you first made to Abraham, Sarah and Jacob. This promise, **the redemption of your people**, you had brought to fulfillment through Mary. I praise you for choosing Catherine to follow Mary's example of faith, self-giving and sacrifice.

With joy she bravely sacrificed everything in the service of women and the poor. Supported by her companions and followers, she unshackled your people across the continents – restoring their faith, and educating them to achieve economic prosperity and positions of power and prestige globally.

Yes my child, but in recent years many of these people's children and grandchildren have forgotten their roots and lost sight of me. They have turned to the worship of their new-found gods: money, property, pleasure and self-sufficiency just as their ancestors did in Israel. Now, **I need you** to walk in the footsteps of Sarah, Rebecca, Miriam, Judith, Mary and Catherine.



Do not be afraid. You have my blessing.

I have chosen you to help to renew the faith, prayer life and moral values of my people once more. In the brokenness of secularism, they are searching unconsciously for wholeness and Mercy. ***Will you re-commit yourself today, and support me, in re-evangelising my people?***

As ecclesial women in partnership with Gabriel, Elizabeth our fore mother in faith, and the Church we pray:

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.
