St. Macartan's Residential Home, Clogher

The Sisters of St. Louis withdrew from St. Macartan's, Clogher, in the late 1960s. At the request of the bishop, the late Most Rev. Dr. Mulligan, the Sisters of Mercy, Enniskillen, bought the house, two gate lodges and nineteen acres of land which included a lake and a forest. The Sisters, in collaboration with the Co Fermanagh and Co Tyrone Authorities, set about establishing a Residential Home for the elderly. The Home was designed to house forty residents of both sexes, together with nurses and staff.

No expense was spared in having the Home equipped suitably and comfortably for the purpose for which it was intended.

Two Sisters employed as Principal and Assistant in the local Primary School were also part of the Clogher community.

In time, a convent building adjoining St. Macartan's was built. For a number of years there was also a Novitiate for the Northern Federation here.

The Provincial Offices of the Sisters of Mercy, Northern Province, are located today in the buildings adjacent to the Residential Home.
