Local Communities	Local Communities are groups of vowed members, committed in faith to the following of Christ, and to one another as Sisters of Mercy. They are established as required according to intent, need, or circumstance as prescribed in the branch statutes.	82.
Self- discerning	The life of the local community is shaped by its members and by our Mercy charism. Through contemplation, discernment and mutual support, it seeks to be a prophetic voice of compassion and justice, and to be a witness to God's steadfast, loving kindness in our evolving world.	
Local Leadership	In a spirit of discernment and shared responsibility the local community chooses local leaders, and distributes other roles as required according to approved statutes.	

Local leaders attend to the well-being of members, remind us of our shared values and commitments, and ensure the community's close connection to other groups within its branch, and to other parts of the Congregation.

Observing the provisions of Church law the local community is a constituent part of a branch. It is established, confirmed, modified or dissolved by the branch leader as circumstances require, following consultation with membership and according to the branch statutes. Unit of a Branch

Intermediate Governance

83.	Diverse geographical Branches constitute the intermediate framework of the Congregation.	Branches
	A branch comprises a designated network of local communities, and is formed with due regard for present and emerging circumstances.	Nature
	It provides for the organisational needs of local community and ministry, and maintains a high level of flexibility and subsidiarity as appropriate.	Function

	The Branch Leader may be elected by the branch membership and confirmed by the Congregational Leadership Team; or she may be appointed by the Congregational Leadership in consultation and discernment with the members. The leader of a branch is accountable Authority to the Congregational Leader and Team according to the Constitutions and Statutes. She receives delegated authority for certain tasks and may represent the Congregational Leader in religious and civil domains, as determined in the congregational statutes.

Within the branch, the leader and team holdResponsibilitydesignated responsibility for the promotion of mission,
the overall care of members and protection of patrimony,
as outlined in the congregational statutes.Responsibility

The Congregational Leadership Team, together with the leaders and teams of the branches, promote and enable co-operation and unity among the branches and within the Congregation.

Union

Congregational Governance

	4. The Congregational Chapter, when in session, is the central unifying authority in the Congregation. It determines the direction and policies for life and mission in accordance with the constitutions and statutes. It elects the Congregational Leader and Team, it evaluates the quality of our religious life together and promotes the charism of the Congregation.
	Chapter is a special instrument of unity and renewal with which all members are invited to engage. Through it we reflect on our fidelity to the Gospel, on the spirit and legacy of our Foundress and on the call to mercy within the context of current reality and the changing profile of membership.
Term	The Chapter is convoked every six years unless otherwise determined by the previous Chapter. The Congregational Leader, with the consent of the Team determines the date and place, and presides at its sessions.
	Should the office of Congregational Leader become vacant, chapter is convoked immediately by the Assistant Leader and, if possible, held within six months, unless a congregational chapter is due within one year.
Composition	Representative of all members, chapter is composed of ex-officio members and elected delegates, as prescribed in the congregational statutes.
??	The Congregational Leader and Team, the Congregational Secretary and Treasurer, are ex-officio members of chapter. The number of elected delegates constitute at least two-thirds of the chapter membership.
Approvals	The Chapter approves congregational statutes prescribing norms for election, representation and other governance matters for the whole Congregation. It approves the overall manner of financing and administering congregational funds.

Chapter

85.	In a spirit of prayerful discernment, the Congregational Leader is elected by the Chapter for a term of six years, and may be re-elected for one consecutive term only. She must be at least six years perpetually professed in the Congregation, reflect faithfulness to the Gospel and to the Congregation, and bear witness to the Mercy way of life. For the election of the Congregational Leader a two-thirds majority is required on the first and second ballots, and an absolute majority on the third and fourth ballots. Only the two candidates with the highest number of votes in the fourth ballot are eligible for the fifth and final ballot. In the event of a tie the election is decided by drawing lots. 86.	The Congregational Team consists of at least four members, as prescribed in the congregational statutes. Team members are elected one by one with an absolute majority on first and second ballots, and a relative majority on any further ballot. Members must be at least four years perpetually professed in the Congregation. Each member is eligible to be re-elected for a second consecutive term.	Team
	The Assistant leader is elected by the Chapter or appointed by the Congregational Leader, from among the already elected members as determined in the congregational statutes. For election, an absolute majority is required on the first two ballots and a relative majority on any further ballot.	Assistant
	The Assistant governs the Congregation should the office of Congregational Leader become vacant or impeded. Should a vacancy arise on the Team the Congregational Leader and Team, acting collegially, elect a successor to complete the Team.	Vacancy

Team members may be given specific responsibilities with appropriate delegated authority. Another person(s) may be co-opted as a team member according to the congregational Statutes.

87. The Congregational Leader exercises personal authority in leading all members, branches, and works of the Congregation, in consultation with the Team, in accordance with universal and proper law and the directives of congregational chapters.

> Together with the Team she constitutes the primary focus of unity and leadership within the Congregation. She maintains a high level of participative leadership and delegates responsibility within the Team.

She confirms the shape and nature of branches after due consultation and with the consent of the Team, as prescribed in the congregational statutes. The Congregational Leader with the consent of the Team, and in consultation with the members of the branch, may establish, modify, or dissolve a branch.

She appoints or confirms sisters to positions of congregational responsibility, and to leadership roles in the branches.

She, or her delegate, makes a formal visitation of the branches as prescribed in the congregational statutes.

The Congregational Leader acts with the consent or advice of the Team for all matters specified in universal or proper law. Delegation Co-option

88. Conscious of Christ's boundless love and mercy, rooted in the interconnectedness of all life, and moved by the wide-spread suffering of our earth community, the Congregational Leader and Team seek to enliven the spirit of 'union and charity' left us by Catherine McAuley, and to be a compassionate presence to our differing realities.

Listening to the voice of membership, and the call of our charism, they facilitate the engagement of all members in works of mercy, in congregational, inter-congregational and societal contexts.

The Congregational Leader and Team regularly gather the leaders of branches in consultative fora to promote unity and discernment throughout the Congregation.

The Congregational Leader and Team give practical interpretation of the Constitutions. They have final responsibility for congregational assets and the approval of internal budgets.
