A Memory Brief – Recent Stages in Process Story

Lent 2017 -

Who will roll away the Stone?

- **Draft 1,** chapter 4 (Buff paper)
- 'Communal Units' to replace provinces?
- 29 pages of comments and questions

Outcome: Acceptance of need for an intermediate structure

Lent 2018 -

I go before you into Galilee

- **Draft 2** (White paper)
- 'Diverse communal Branches' to replace provinces?...
- 1,300 sisters attended meetings and signed questionnaire

<u>Outcome</u>: 1,268 sisters 'could live with it' and looked to Congregation Chapter to consider and vote on it.

Easter 2018

- **Draft 3** (White Booklet)
- all four chapters of Constitutions revised
- Statutes included

May 2018

• CLT make formal proposal to Congregational Chapter to consider and vote on Revision of Constitutions (chaps 1- 4)

July 2018

CONGREGATIONAL CHAPTER

- Civil Lawyers implications re Trusts/finances/companies etc
- Advice of Canon lawyers as to timing of canonical and civil changes: agree canonical changes first, and then seek civil alignment
- Chapter Delegates affirmed Model ('Branches' in draft 3), directed that further work was needed, and mandated the CLT to continue the process
- **Vote** on Statement (*Chapter Card God's Call*) each part separately
- Unanimous vote 65 yes, on each. (cf minutes of Chapter 2018)

November 2019

Plenary Conference - Options explored and presented-

- (1) Virtual Branches focused on common interest
- (2) Geographical Branches area based
- (3) Charism carriers incorporating lay colleagues
 - Strong preference indicated for option (2) Geographical Branches
 - CLT endorses a similar approach

March 2020 – December 2020

- Community Process to engage with and explore 'geographical branches'
- Chapter 4 of Draft 3 updated to reflect 'God's Call' and preference expressed by Plenary Conference (4.2)
