St. Agnes Parish, Point Loma and St. Mary Magdalen Parish, San Diego After retiring as Principal of Our Lady of Grace School, El Cajon in 1977 and doing a degree in theology, Sr. Bríd McDonnell was invited in 1978 by Monsignor Edward Creighton to be Director of Religious Education at St. Agnes Parish, Point Loma.

Some years later, at the request of Monsignor Billy Bolger, she moved from St. Agnes Parish to St. Mary Magdalen Parish, San Diego and around 1987 - 1988 retired to Ireland.

Good Shepherd Parish, San Diego, 1982 – 1994

In 1982, Monsignor Eamon Lyng requested Sisters to assist in opening a new parish school St. Didacus community. Sisters Bernardine Morrisroe and Evelyn Cleary were chosen as Principal and Assistant Principal. They began with grades 1, 2 and 3, and in 1983, they added grades 4 and 5.
